NOTICE OF PROHIBITION

WHEREAS on or about July 8, 2015, Tara Chambers ("Chambers"), former employee of Sears Spokane Employees Federal Credit Union, was sentenced on the charge of Theft, Embezzlement, or Misapplication by a Bank Officer or Employee, 18 U.S.C. § 657, a charge to which she had previously pleaded guilty, in the U.S. District Court for the Eastern District of Washington;

WHEREAS a violation of 18 U.S.C. § 657 is a criminal offense involving dishonesty and breach of trust;

NOW, THEREFORE, YOU ARE HEREBY NOTIFIED THAT:

1. Pursuant to 12 U.S. C. § 1785(d)(1)(A) and 12 U.S.C. § 1829(a)(1)(A), Chambers is prohibited from becoming an "institution affiliated party" of any insured depository institution, as defined in 12 U.S.C. § 1786(r); otherwise participating, directly or indirectly, in the conduct of the affairs of any insured depository institution; and owning or controlling, directly or indirectly, any insured depository institution;

- 2. Pursuant to 12 U.S. C. § 1785(d)(1)(B) and 12 U.S.C. § 1829(a)(1)(B), no insured depository institution may permit Chambers to engage in any conduct or continue in any relationship prohibited in paragraph 1 above;
- 3. Pursuant to 12 U.S.C. § 1785(d)(3) and 12 U.S.C. § 1829(b), whoever knowingly violates paragraph 1 or 2 above is subject to a fine of not more than \$1 million for each day such prohibition is violated, or imprisonment for not more than five (5) years, or both;
- 4. The "Judgment in a Criminal Case" document, Case No. 2:14CR00175-RMP-1, is made a part hereof and is incorporated herein by reference; and
- 5. This Notice of Prohibition shall be effective and enforceable on the date set forth below.

The defendant shall not unlawfully possess a controlled substance. The defendant shall refrain from any unlawful use of a controlled substance. The defendant shall submit to one drug test within 15 days of release from imprisonment and at least two periodic drug tests thereafter, as determined by the court.

The above drug testing condition is suspended, based on the court's determination that the defendant poses a low risk of future substance abuse. (Check, if applicable.)

The defendant shall not possess a firearm, ammunition, destructive device, or any other dangerous weapon. (Check, if applicable.)

The defendant shall cooperate in the collection of DNA as directed by the probation officer. (Check, if applicable.)

- 7) the defendant shall refrain from excessive use of alcohol and shall not purchase, possess, use, distribute, or administer any controlled substance or any paraphernalia related to any controlled substances, except as prescribed by a physician;
- 8) the defendant shall not frequent places where controlled substances are illegally sold, used, distributed, or administered;
- 9) the defendant shall not associate with any persons engaged in criminal activity and shall not associate with any person convicted of a felony, unless granted permission to do so by the probation officer;
- the defendant shall permit a probation officer to visit him or her at any time at home or elsewhere and shall permit confiscation of any contraband observed in plain view of the probation officer;
- 11) the defendant shall notify the probation officer within seventy-two hours of being arrested or questioned by a law enforcement officer;
- 12) the defendant shall not enter into any agreement to act as an informer or a special agent of a law enforcement agency without the permission of the court; and
- as directed by the probation officer, the defendant shall notify third parties of risks that may be occasioned by the defendant's criminal record or personal history or characteristics and shall permit the probation officer to make such notifications and to confirm the defendant's compliance with such notification requirement.

- 14) You shall participate in the home confinement program for 4 months. You are restricted to your residence at all times except for preapproved employment, education, religious services, medical, substance abuse, or mental health treatment, attorney visits, court appearances, court-ordered obligations, or other activities as preapproved by the supervising officer that are not recreational in nature.
- 15) You shall complete a mental health evaluation and follow any treatment recommendations of the evaluating professional which do not require forced or psychotropic medication and/or inpatient confinement, absent further order of the court. You shall allow reciprocal release of information between the supervising officer and treatment provider. You shall contribute to the cost of treatment according to your ability to pay.
- 16) You shall provide the supervising officer with access to any requested financial information, including authorization to conduct credit checks and obtain copies of your federal income tax returns. You shall disclose all assets and liabilities to the supervising officer. You shall not transfer, sell, give away, or otherwise convey any asset, without the advance approval of the supervising officer.
- 17) You shall not incur any new debt, open additional lines of credit, or enter into any financial contracts, without the advance approval of the supervising officer.
- 18) You shall submit your person, residence, office, or vehicle to a search, conducted by a probation officer, at a sensible time and manner, based upon reasonable suspicion of contraband or evidence of violation of a condition of supervision. Failure to submit to search may be grounds for revocation. You shall warn persons with whom you share a residence that the premises may be subject to search.
- 19) You shall complete 240 hours of community service work at a not-for-profit site approved in advance by the supervising officer. The hours are to be completed in full no later than June 2017.
