NOTICE OF PROHIBITION

WHEREAS on or about June 17, 2016, Lisa Hauptmann ("Hauptmann") was sentenced on the charge of Embezzlement of Credit Union Funds, 18 U.S.C. § 657, a charge to which she pleaded guilty, in the U.S. District Court for the Western District of Pennsylvania, in connection with her employment at Oil Country Federal Credit Union;

WHEREAS a violation of 18 U.S.C. § 657 is a criminal offense involving dishonesty and breach of trust;

NOW, THEREFORE, YOU ARE HEREBY NOTIFIED THAT:

- 1. Pursuant to 12 U.S. C. § 1785(d)(1)(A) and 12 U.S.C. § 1829(a)(1)(A), Hauptmann is prohibited from becoming an "institution affiliated party" of any insured depository institution, as defined in 12 U.S.C. § 1786(r); otherwise participating, directly or indirectly, in the conduct of the affairs of any insured depository institution; and owning or controlling, directly or indirectly, any insured depository institution;
- 2. Pursuant to 12 U.S. C. § 1785(d)(1)(B) and 12 U.S.C. § 1829(a)(1)(B), no insured depository institution may permit Hauptmann to engage in any conduct or continue in any relationship prohibited in paragraph 1 above;

- 3. Pursuant to 12 U.S.C. § 1785(d)(3) and 12 U.S.C. § 1829(b), whoever knowingly violates paragraph 1 or 2 above is subject to a fine of not more than \$1 million for each day such prohibition is violated, or imprisonment for not more than five (5) years, or both:
- 4. The "Judgment in a Criminal Case" document, Case No. 1:15cr00032-001, is made a part hereof and is incorporated herein by reference; and

Upon release from imprisonment, the defendant shall be on supervised release for a term of four (4) years at Count 1

The defendant must report to the probation office in the district to which the defendant is released within 72 hours of release from the custody of the Bureau of Prisons.

The defendant shall not commit another federal, state or local crime.

The defendant shall not unlawfully possess a controlled substance. The defendant shall refrain from any unlawful use of a controlled substance. The defendant shall submit to one drug test within 15 days of release from imprisonment and at least two periodic drug tests thereafter, as determined by the court.

- 4) the defendant shall support his or her dependents and meet other family responsibilities;
- 5) the defendant shall work regularly at a lawful occupation, unless excused by the probation officer for schooling, training, or other acceptable reasons;
- 6) the defendant shall notify the probation officer at least ten days prior to any change in residence or employment;
- 7) the defendant shall refrain from excessive use of alcohol and shall not purchase, possess, use, distribute, or administer any controlled substance or any paraphernalia related to any controlled substances, except as prescribed by a physician;
- 8) the defendant shall not frequent places where controlled substances are illegally sold, used, distributed, or administered;
- 9) the defendant shall not associate with any persons engaged in criminal activity and shall not associate with any person convicted of a felony, unless granted permission to do so by the probation officer;
- 10) the defendant shall permit a probation officer to visit him or her at any time at home or elsewhere and shall permit confiscation of any contraband observed in plain view of the probation officer,
- 11) the defendant shall notify the probation officer within seventy-two hours of being arrested or questioned by a law enforcement officer,
- 12) the defendant shall not enter into any agreement to act as an informer or a special agent of a law enforcement agency without the permission of the court; and
- 13) as directed by the probation officer, the defendant shall notify third parties of risks that may be occasioned by the defendant's criminal record or personal history or characteristics and shall permit the probation officer to make such notifications and to confirm the defendant's compliance with such notification requirement

ADDITIONAL SUPERVISED RELEASE TERMS

- 1 Defendant shall serve an initial six (6) month period of community confinement at Renewal, Inc. During this time, defendant shall abide by the rules of the facility and comply with all directives of her facility supervisor and probation officer. Defendant shall report to Renewal, Inc. as directed by the Probation Office. It is the court's intention that defendant be granted work-release for any legitimate employment available to defendant during this time.
- 2. Defendant shall thereafter be placed on home detention for a period of six (6) months. During this time, the defendant shall remain at her place of residence except for employment and other activities approved in advance by the probation officer. In the discretion of the probation officer, defendant shall wear an electronic device and shall observe the rules specified by the probation department. The defendant shall pay the cost of any electronic monitoring not to exceed the daily contractual rate. Payment for any electronic monitoring shall be made in accordance with the probation officer's direction. Changes to the established rate can be made by the probation officer subject to supervisory approval;
- 3. Defendant shall not use or possess controlled substances except as prescribed by a licensed medical practitioner for a legitimate medical purpose;
- 4 Defendant shall provide the probation officer with access to any requested financial information;
- 5. Defendant shall not incur new credit charges or open additional lines of credit without the approval of the probation officer;
- 6 Defendant shall make periodic payments of at least ten (10%) percent of her gross monthly income toward any outstanding balance of restitution. Payments shall be made in such amounts and at such times as directed by the probation office and approved by the court. The probation office shall address the defendant's (1) financial resources and assets, (2) earnings and income and (3) financial obligations as they then exist in submitting any recommended payment schedule for court approval; and
- 7. Pursuant to 28 C.F.R. § 28.12, the DNA Fingerprint Act of 2005 and the Adam Walsh Child Protection and Safety Act of 2006, defendant shall cooperate in the collection of DNA as directed by the probation office.
